The role of the science community

70 scientists from 17 countries gathered to contribute to the conservation of the Neretva river system

What did they find (data from the first science week)?

over 1,000 species and 300 species at this area were known from before 24 are new species for Bosnia and Herzegovina and eight species new to science, one officially confirmed and is named after the Neretva River – Baeoura neretvaensis
